Welcome to Agincourt, Dolphin: Or, Don't Eat at the Restaurant If They Insist on Feeding You Poison

The Toxic Slop of UFO Media

I'm an idiot for having believed them in the first place.

The toxin distributor who coined the phrase "Emma Woods idiots" reiterated his charge on another blog recently, you can find it in the [sidebar](#). (Click for site: Sidebar element deleted. Don't want to be accused of parasitizing their celebrity.)

Let's be clear about the chronology here: he called friends of Emma Woods idiots first. He threw the first punch. If I'm just supposed to take it, that is another reason to mount booster rockets on the "community" and launch it into deep space.

The "community" as a whole and its celebrities in particular refuse to accept responsibility for the consequences of its ideas and its propensity for sickening the public. Its primary sin is the sin of turning the other way when people die, are made crazy, or are marginalized as a result of taking claims about the paranormal seriously, especially claims regarding the presence of extraterrestrials on the planet, a claim I have had in the past some sympathy for.

That ends today. Having run the gauntlet of the true believers, having endured their threats and vitriol for challenging one of the ETH's high priests, having been banned on forums and having had my intelligence insulted by their podcasts, I now turn to the Dark Side.

The ETH may have a friend in probability math and in the testimony of pilots and military personnel, but it has an enemy in me. The Church of the ETH in particular.

I'm not an enemy because there is absence of truth, but because there is an absence of responsibility. It certainly is fun to be irresponsible and carefree and call people idiots. Your party, though, involves freakefaction of the objects of your disdain.

Let me have a little *irresponsible fun at their expense*. The uncle of the renownist in question used to work on classified defense projects. His buddy in the "community" is a friend of disinformationists who perform psychological operations on their own countrymen. Some have concluded that the buddy's master, a collaborator with uncle, hoaxed the notorious MJ-12 documents. The ETH with which they flirt is the same virus infecting the minds of the alien-abduction hypnotists. An interesting cluster of credentials.

Let's detonate this ridiculous bomb, shall we. Paranormal celebrities love to debilitate minds with conspiracy theories. Let's join them in a bowl of poison. And please understand my intent: I intend to do demolition on the idea that I have any connection whatsoever to the "community."

One of the explanations provided for UFOs is that they're all U.S. hardware. We've just witnessed ten years of absolute *world ruin* owing to the attempt to characterize

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Islam believers as a global threat. Islam believers were a threat to oil companies and defense contractors. They were hardly a global threat.

There is only one strategic purpose to creating a global threat and that is global hegemony.

To state this sick analytic differently, it is in the economic best interests of the defense industry, as outlined in the business plans *cum* global dominance theories perpetuated at the DoD, to have in place a global threat against whom the world can rally in the form of a common enemy. We've just witnessed the great WMD hoax. The strategic utility of hoaxing the existence of a malevolent alien race ought to be obvious. The world-historic explosion of paranoia would unite the world under one banner, which of course, *it goes without saying*, would be the Star-Spangled banner.

Perhaps the film *Best Evidence* is nothing more than a propaganda film designed to convince us we should be forever engaged in a global war. And if it isn't propaganda, it certainly could be co-opted as such. Perhaps the film-maker in question is really a Neocon pretty boy in disguise. Maybe he supports John Bolton for President.

Perhaps his attempt to shut the idiots up is political maneuvering to preserve uncle's ETH.

Who knows? More importantly, to paraphrase the film-maker's buddy, who cares?

How's that for irresponsibility? You don't like that wild goose chase? You don't like that Tantalus Myth? You don't like that bowl of poison? Then stop pouring your own. You've given me carrots to chase most of my life. Why don't you chase the above carrot for a while? See how it improves your living conditions.

You're entitled to your delusions and you're entitled to your buddy-system approach to the truth, but you're not entitled to pound people in my presence and you're not entitled to post glib, uninformed encyclicals, in podcasts or on forums, roundly denouncing people who do not subscribe to your religion or accusing them of lacking knowledge you clearly don't possess yourself.

The "community" is accountable for the ideas it professes and willingness to accept responsibility for those ideas and their impact on the lives of believers is crucial to their defense and their acceptance. The notion among the celebrity subculture of the "community" is that the Emma Woods dispute is not a package deal, that somehow they will *not* be lumped in with who I call "the perpetrator" in the case and that their consciences are clear.

That is a naive position. Most assuredly, if the case went public, the test would be put to David Jacobs regarding the existence of extraterrestrials. Most assuredly, if the case went public, the reaction in the mainstream would be *nausea*. Most assuredly, the Church of the ETH would come under severe bombardment.

Most assuredly, the people who said nothing will have their life's work appraised in light of revelations regarding alien-abduction hypnotism. It is foolish to the point of public intoxication to believe that the mainstream media would deal with the UFO Community in any way but the harshest possible. Why David Jacobs is the only one aware of this I don't know. He counts on it to rally the troops. At least he is aware of his warfighting responsibilities.

The pompous and the insulated are not.

I provided the community with a practice exam. The real thing is considerably more powerful and devastating.

There has been plenty warning of this in the "community" itself. The air raid sirens have been sounding for quite awhile. The saucer smitten have gone about their day, listening to Jimmy Durante tunes about little green men, pining for the days of the contactees, burying their heads in the sand. The good sense of those in the community who saw the danger and understood it was considerably unheeded and the consequences will not be pretty.

To the outside world, the "community" is a package deal. I understand that isn't fair. I understand that people will be unfairly judged. But that is where it is headed. People who tell you differently are either not cognizant of the way the real world works or they have been rendered constitutionally incompetent by standing too close to the microwave of the paranormal.

The sober in the community have the right to a hurricane warning and they have a right to pack their bags in response. The smugly dug-in will receive the obliteration their arrogance deserves.

That the community leads people on life-long wild goose chases is easily

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demonstrated. That we are invited to flail away at wind-mills for the rest of our days on earth is easily demonstrated. That we are continually sickened with the idea that there is a cabal of evil men holding back the truth from us in a cosmic cover-up is evidenced by this simple fact: *there is absolutely nothing we can do about it*. People who say we can stop well-armed, well-funded, powerful men with toys capable of delivering weapons to our front porch that would supplant our homesteads with craters are being irresponsible. Their insistence this can be done acts as a poison in the lives of the faithful.

The Tantalus Myth is a myth about torture. It is also descriptive about the UFO Community. The saucer is the carrot perpetually dangled in front of us. We're meant to chase after it until we die of exhaustion. The process is a waste of life. It isn't just a waste of time, it is a *WASTE OF LIFE*. *Getting spooked about government cover-ups and corrupt and evil men you have no shot at confronting is a waste of time and it is a waste of life.*

Pray you, avoid it.

I don't dispute that there are evil men in the highest echelons of power. I don't dispute they lie to us. I am saying I don't have the advanced weaponry to combat them. And neither do you. You can dance around like a bantam rooster all you want, and you sound good on a podcast, but you can't beat them. The only place anyone can defeat evil men is in the space between the ears.

And the evil ones have an advantage there as well. The paranoia we are encouraged to indulge in the community produces a weakness in the one stronghold we do have: the mind. We're supposed to see a ruthless conspiracy behind everything and we're supposed to tremble at the awe-inspiring national security state, with its secrecy superpowers and its drone attacks. To engender rage toward the inherent injustice of it all is to render oneself absolutely impotent.

I hold the "community" accountable for the alien-abduction hypnotist scandal. For that, they complain. I bought the bill of goods they sold me. When I tried to return the items I bought, they wanted to see the receipt. When I showed them the receipt, they said all sales were final.

Now they're trying to tell me they're not responsible for the alien-abduction hypnotist lemon they sold me. Now they're trying to slick one over on me about how harmless their culture is.

Now they're trying to tell me people don't get sick reading their stuff, people don't go crazy taking their religion seriously, and people don't die as a result of becoming submerged in the "phenomenon."

Is that true? Is it really as safe and hunky dory as they imply?

I don't know. You tell me. A guy sends me an e-mail telling me he's an alien human hybrid and links me to his webpage where I get treated to kids with half-blown-off heads, arm bones sticking out with the hands fractured off, and dead bodies strewn all over hell's half acre. You tell me what your culture is doing to people, sports fans.

Who do I blame for that? David Jacobs? No, because I know where this gentleman got the poison that inspired his diatribe: *Speculative Realms*. I spoonfed him the same toxic slop I got fed. Maybe it doesn't burden the souls of the spooky cognoscenti that people get sickened by their culture, but it bothers me.

A lot.

OK, "community", where are the healthy people in your fan base? Where are the thriving in your fan base? Are they all celebrities? Don't you think that's a tad suspicious?

For me, the Emma Woods Scandal has discredited the UFO Community. There is no sense in pretending I now have any sympathy for its pursuits. I lost my faith. I'm an enemy now. You may as well know it. You may as well know I can't support it anymore. It will make things easier for you, especially if you're looking for "community" friendly theories and speculation.

You're not going to find that here anymore. I apologize, but the damage is done. I'm not going to spar eternally with celebrities whose exploits are bound to be unfruitful, if not toxic and harmful, who'll never show you a saucer, never show you an alien, never provide you with the ultimate explanation. You can be their pilot fish but they are on a swim to nowhere. And their blind faith enables catastrophes like the Emma Woods incident to happen.

And they happen repeatedly. Or am I wrong? I mean, if this is the Norman Vincent Peale world of eternally positive outcomes let me know. I'll admit my mistake.

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Now, there needs to be a bit of surgery performed here. It is necessary to excise the individual in the "community" from its collective. There are many individuals who can't be assessed penalties for the collective's behavior. And their raw courage is a reason to believe – not in an alien race but – in the human race.

These folk are independently minded. They check facts. They do their homework. They haven't been "mindfucked" or snowjobbed. More importantly, they don't mindfuck or snowjob people themselves. While little green men may not exist, these individuals DO exist. They're real, authentic human beings.

But there are people in the community who pose as individuals. In actuality, they're what Ortega might call mass "men." They don't do their homework. They're not independently minded. They let the collective do their thinking for them. They DO attempt mindfucks and snowjobs because it is easier to force compliance than it is to persuade people into participating.

Our responsibility is persuasion not the manufacture of consent.

These mass "men" are Kierkegaard's fantastical beings. Though they sound like real people on podcasts they're fakes. They are literally existential hoaxes.

The existential hoax is the one-to-one equivalent to the people Charles Fort called the "damned alive." They are hollowed out zombies, so light – because gutless – they float; so unanchored they're blown by every shift in the wind.

The individual in the "community" threatens the collective. "The Threat" sensed in the Emma Woods dispute originates in the individual's noncompliance with the collective.

These are our heroes, says the collective, citing such and such a film or such and such a book, and bow before them you will. Kneel before Zod, you sucka!

I pick my own heroes, thank you. And let's be clear about this disassociation: I work alone. I alone am responsible for what you read here. *I am not part of a team.* There's no buddy system to the truth and I have no affiliated union of podcast celebrities ready to defend my honor upon every insult. I don't have a buddy whose mindfuck exploits I'm honor bound, by contract, to defend on blogs or on podcasts I've weaseled my way onto. There are no old UFO warhorses I suck up to, or pander to, to win unearned credit with the masses. I don't hoax the community through mass appeal.

The present "Emma Woods Idiots" hoax is another in a long series of attempted mindfucks of the individual by the loudmouth podcast collective in the "community." It is a subcultural acknowledgement of the threat an authentic individual poses to the paranormal community's company line.

There are folks who rightly observe that the term "mindfuck" is an obscenity. I reply that it is the perfect technical description for what happened to Emma Woods. It is also a descriptive fit for that crime's cultural antecedents in the "community."

What happened to Emma Woods was an obscenity. And the "community" is responsible. *So am I, by my participation in its culture* and I have expressed my guilt time and again to Miss Woods and I've apologized to her. The term "mindfuck" describes the malicious intent involved and it describes the cultural Munchausen disease killing off the "community." The community has contempt for its members and means them harm. That is why it's a Munchausen culture. Why else would there be so much bickering?

My participation in the paranormal subculture constituted complicity in the organized mindfuck of Emma Woods. It will shame me to my dying day.

The Munchausen Syndrome by Proxy permeating UFO culture allowed for the emergence, development, and outrageous success of the alien-abduction hypnotists. They perfected the art, which was and still is being cultivated in the community, of sickening patrons for the purpose of achieving renown. It's not by accident that paranormal celebrities are so contemptuous of the people who consume their products. The morons and idiots they refer to on their broadcasts are their patrons.

And yet, their patrons provide them with renown. They're not appreciative of it. *In fact, they attack the patrons!*

I was one of their patrons. That's how I got involved in this – listening to paranormal podcasts. I thought *Speculative Realms* was going to be a fan blog only. I didn't anticipate becoming so revolted by the behavior of the paranormal elite that I was forced to check their work behind them. This was supposed to be fun. It wasn't supposed to be forensic journalism. Instead of a good time, it turned into one long

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slog through corruption. You come for a party and it turns into a crime scene.

There are people who speak the truth in the "community." Too often, they cast their pearls before swine. The swine, then, swallow the pearls whole.

Like an Orwellian nightmare, the pigs are in charge. This means you have to gut several pigs to get at the truth in the UFO Community.

To imbibe the cultural products of the community you must pay a price, like any poor kid with a Munchausen parent. The price you pay is being made a freak by paranormal celebrities who resent having to cater to you in exchange for their renown. Like the Munchausen nurse, they sicken the patient.

They're interested in whose intelligence they can insult and which freak they can mock in front of their fanboys. Again, *it can't be repeated enough, certainly*, there are sober people in the community. They know what they're doing. They provide accurate information. They won't serve you poison. It isn't my intent to tell you everyone in the community is corrupt.

I'm telling you that the existential hoaxes, who sit before microphones and decide FOR YOU how to think, do their dead level best to drown the sober people out. They're the princes of a hovel unfit to live in. The solutions they suggest are unlivable. Either you're Tantalus/Quixote and you eternally grasp at carrots or chase windmills or you're fit to a procrustean bed by hypnotic freakfection.

Theirs is a culture of despair meant to revolt against you in your mind once you've had a chance to think. It is only after a paranormal babble session settles in your system for a few hours that you begin to feel nauseous. It is a timed-release emetic.

Once again, there are folks on solid ground. They're working hard at clearing the way. They're placing research on firmer ground and they deserve your support. They're worth watching. They're worth listening to.

The people dedicated to hoaxing you about "idiots," people that, in order to preserve their renown, are viscerally committed to shutting you up, do not deserve your support. The term *Emma Woods Idiots* was invented by a paranormal dauphin with a pretty way of talking who gets on podcasts too often and has a royalty pass to the podium. He believes his royalty permits him to send people to the tower.

Welcome to Agincourt, Dolphin. Thank you for the tennis balls.

"And tell the pleasant prince, this mock of his hath turn'd his balls to gun-stones; and his soul shall stand sore charged for the wasteful vengeance that shall fly with them: for many a thousand widows shall this his mock mock out of their dear husbands; mock mothers from their sons, mock castles down, and some are yet ungoten, and unborn, that shall have cause to curse the Dauphin's scorn. I don't have to recommend to you that you are forced to eat at a restaurant where poison is served.* I certainly don't have to worship a culture that throws its patrons under the bus. The culture is toxic. And I'll not have it any longer. I mean, you guys and gals are free to do what you want.

But this is ridiculous.

This site will continue to exist for historical purposes. I will strip it in the coming days of feeds directing people to the "community." I know there are good people there but they don't need to be damned by a reference from me. It will take a few weeks to get things pared down so if you see a feed you like or use one repeatedly please go to that site and subscribe. I will provide research links for you in the future but that is as far as I'll go.

There will be posts in the future, some by other people. But it is only fair to warn you that my orientation has shifted to devoted hostility to the cause. My faith is gone.

If you only read stuff you agree with, this might not be the best spot for you.

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All Emma Woods Posts

Anathema—A formal ecclesiastical ban, curse, or excommunication (American Heritage Dictionary); one that is accursed by ecclesiastical authority (definition 1(a), Webster's Ninth New Collegiate Dictionary).

In the late part of the first decade of this century, I read legal briefs pertaining to the **Catholic Sex Abuse Scandal**.

Taxonomical analysis of that Scandal and the Emma Woods Scandal offers, I believe, virtually identical presentation.

This is why I maintain that the animus directed at Emma Woods, a literate experiencer, is an attack upon intelligence and why I believe the attackers are paranormal papists.

Mindfuck is, at least partially, defined as an *attack upon intelligence*.

Hence, the application of the papal epithet, *Emma Woods Idiots*.

The analogy continues to be useful when you understand that the Catholic Church was the birthplace of the modern scholar and UFO **Scholasticism** gives the UFO Papist the air of authority which can deceive you into venturing off-point.

Unfortunately, the Internet age applied high voltage energy to the literacy of experiencers, as it provided access to multiple applicable disciplines experiencers were then able to use to educate themselves and to analyze their experiences and their treatment at the hands of UFO Papists.

The community, as viewed through the Emma Woods Scandal, is largely, therefore, a *religious community, one in which punishment is administered for refusal to pay for indulgences*.

However, the Internet age makes the suppression of literacy impossible.

Literacy constitutes the true threat to the UFO Community.
